BA Hons Primary and Early Years Education with Qualified Teacher Status (School Based)

Overview: The BA Honours Primary and Early Years Education programme is a school-based, three-year undergraduate course leading to Qualified Teacher Status (QTS). This course allows you to specialise in ages 3 -11 in a Primary school.

Entry Requirements

- A minimum of 5 GCSE's at grade 4 (previously grade C). These must include English Language, Mathematics and Science or equivalent
- 112 UCAS tariff points from A level or equivalent

Benefits

- Students will be placed in a school environment from the start of their training
- Students who may not wish to train on a traditional university course or study a subject specific degree, can study for their degree in a cost effective way
- Students will take part in a variety of training that focusses on developing a reflective and critical evaluation of research, practice and policy
- Each year, the student will be based in a contrasting school nearby to where they live
- All Professional Studies and Pedagogy Sessions will be led by a group of highly experienced Lead Professional Mentors and Specialist Leaders in Education
- Each student will receive one-to-one support specific to their individual needs

Overview

This three year programme leading to Qualified Teacher Status (QTS) enables learners to gain their degree whilst studying on the job to become a Newly Qualified Teacher (NQT). Specialise in ages 3 – 11 in a Primary school placement and attend training sessions to develop your theoretical subject knowledge and teaching techniques.

Course Delivery

Trainees will be placed in a host school for two days each week. One and a half days will be self-directed study time and enrichment activities. One and a half days will be directed study with Haybridge Alliance SCITT based at:

- Haybridge High School and Sixth Form, Brake Lane, Hagley, DY8 2XS
- Pinvin Federation, Main Street, Pinvin, Pershore, WR10 2ER

Benefits

School based training means that students will be placed in a school environment from the start of their training, learning from experienced teachers whilst using and applying their knowledge and understanding to classroom learning through teaching placements.

Students will take part in a variety of training which focusses on developing a reflective and critical evaluation of research, practise and policy to ensure that their pedagogical knowledge reflects current thinking.

Each year the student will be based in a contrasting school placement so they have a wide experience of working in a variety of schools.

Smaller cohorts allow us to offer specialised one-to-one support to each individual student.

Haybridge Alliance SCITT is able to offer a bespoke approach to this undergraduate programme and the achievement of Qualified Teacher Status (QTS).

Students will be able to access campus, resources and facilities at both Haybridge Alliance SCITT and Birmingham City.

Assessment Method

The Teachers' Standards form the basis of assessments of student progress throughout the year. Each half term our School-Based Trainers refer to our step-by-step framework for assessing student teachers, which explicitly states the competencies students are required to demonstrate, not just in teaching, but overall as a teacher. It is used to support regular summative assessments and used formatively to identify where training opportunities are needed. This framework is shared directly with students so that they are well-equipped to self-evaluate and prioritise targets for their continued development.



Students are assessed through a combination of evidence portfolios, reflective journals, written assignments, written examinations, group presentations, case studies and a research project in their final year, as well as through observations of their teaching practise.

Students will receive feedback on their interactions with children, and then gradually focus more specifically on how effectively their teaching promotes learning. When overall judgements are made on the quality of lessons, School-Based Trainers will refer to the set criteria which have been developed by the Alliance, which are founded on the Ofsted Framework for School Inspections. This ensures consistency of judgement across the Alliance, as well as allowing students to understand from the very beginning how qualified teachers are judge in terms of their teaching.

Facilities and Local Amenities

Based at Haybridge High School and Sixth Form, our Professional Studies Centre offers access to free Wi-Fi, free car parking and free-flow coffee, tea and water, along with access to our library of resources.

This provides you with an opportunity to further build on your relationships with fellow students, gain further insight into key areas of becoming a teacher and learn more about the tasks you will be required to complete in order to complete your second and third year.

Throughout your training, you will be supported and guided by mentors and lead mentors to ensure you gain the best experience with us. Your mentors will work with you to help you develop the highest standards of professional expertise.

At the end of your first year, you will then spend your second year in a contrasting placement before returning to your main placement school in your third year.


