1. What are the Entry Requirements?

A minimum of 5 GCSEs at grade 4 (previously grade C). These must include English Language, Mathematics and Science or equivalent.

2. When is the start date of the programme?

The programme will start in September 2020.

3. How long will the course last for?

The Primary Education Undergraduate Programme is a three year, full time programme.

4. Can I work at the same time as completing the programme?

Yes, you will be able to work at the same time as completing the programme.

5. How can I apply for the BA Hons Primary and Early Years Education with Qualified Teacher Status (School Based) programme?

6. How many hours of class time and school time should I expect a week?

Each week, students will spend 2 days in their host school and one and a half days of directed study at Haybridge High School and Sixth Form, Hagley and Pinvin Federation, Pershore. The remaining one and a half days will be self-directed study time.

7. What are the benefits of studying with us as opposed to a larger institution?

With a smaller cohort, we can provide you personalised one-to-one support that larger institutions will not be able to do. We help you every step of the way throughout the programme, helping you on the way to becoming an expert in your field.

8. Will I get support for Dyslexia or for my disability?

We make individual recommendations about the support you'll need, such as:

- particular exam arrangements
- extra time for assignments
- handouts in advance of taught sessions
- written material in a particular format
- being allowed to take a note taker or voice recorder into taught sessions

If you require practical assistance you may need e.g. if you require a note taker, a British Sign Language interpreter or regular sessions with a dyslexia support tutor or a mentor, this is usually funded via [Disabled Students' Allowances](#).

9. Will there be opportunities to socialise with other students on the course?

During the three year programme, there will be plenty of opportunities to socialise with other students on the course. You will spend one and a half days in directed study at Haybridge High School and Sixth Form or Pinvin Federation where you will work alongside your fellow undergraduates learning more about what makes a good primary school teacher.

You will remain in your school for a year, before moving to a contrasting school the following year in order to provide you with a wide range of experience in the classroom.
